




### **MACM**

The MACM prepares students to lead and serve in specialized ministries within their faith communities. MACM students develop a broad foundation of theological understanding that can be adapted to a variety of ministry contexts. Students are equipped with a theological framework and the practical skills necessary for local church ministry.


Formats include Residential, Fully Online, and Hybrid:

- Residential Program Spring (January) or Fall (August)
- Online Program Fall ONLY (August)

#### MACM & MS in Organizational Leadership with a Nonprofit Concentration

This program is designed to prepare students for leadership in both faith-based communities and today's complex organizations by developing the practical abilities and skills needed in those settings. Through exploring nonprofit specific strategies in development, budget, volunteerism, governance, and strategic planning, this program is ideal for those seeking to create change in their communities.

- · 60 credit hours, as little as 3 years
- Students attending full-time in the residential MACM program can expect to complete both degrees in two years including summers.
- Students who are a part of the online MACM program can expect to complete both degrees in three years including summers.



## **Application**

All applicants for admission to the School of Theology at Mercer University are required to hold a bachelor's degree with a liberal arts core from a college or university nationally accredited by an institutional accrediting body recognized by the United States Department of Education or proof of an equivalent degree from a foreign university.

#### 1. Submit Online App



 Ask your Admissions Counselor for a code to waive your application fee!

#### 2. Background Check

 Background Check\*: Completed online at Castle Branch. Please allow up to a month for us to receive the report. The package cost is \$31.75, which must be ordered and purchased directly online by the applicant.

#### 3. Additional Written Documents

The following can be uploaded by the applicant to the online application portal or emailed to **theologyadmissions@mercer.edu** 

- Resume: Including church positions and service; secular occupations; community involvement; academic honors; and research, civic, or leadership awards.
- Autobiographical Essay: In 1,250-1,500 words speak to the following four questions: Give an account of your Christian pilgrimage. Tell the story of your personal commitment and call to ministry. What factors have led you to apply to McAfee School of Theology for your theological training? What are your ministry goals (the kind of ministries you envision for yourself)?
- Writing Sample: 2,000-2,500 words of an academic paper on any topic. This may be an excerpt of an academic paper on any topic.
   Please include bibliography and in-text citations or footnotes.

Applicants who do not have an academic writing sample may email theologyadmissions@mercer.edu for a prompt. Must include a bibliography and in-text citations or footnotes.

If you are applying to the fully online MACM program, you will also need to submit:

 Letter of Church Support: All applicants to the Online MACM program must fill out the Letter of Church Support form stating that they will be connected with a church during their time in the online program. The form outlines the expectations of the church and student.

#### 4. Official Transcripts

The following will need to be submitted to us **directly from** your recommenders and your higher education institutions:

 Official Transcripts: Required from all higher educational institutions previously attended. Applicants are required to have a regionally accredited bachelor's degree or proof of an equivalent degree from a foreign university. Transcripts can be submitted electronically from your previous school's ordering service or through the mail in a sealed envelope to:

#### 5. Recommendations

Applicants will need a total of three recommenders to complete our MACM Recommendation Form. Your recommenders can submit the completed form to us at **theologyadmissions@mercer.edu** Recommenders chosen must consist of the following:

- · Pastor/Church Leader
- Professor/Supervisor
- · Professor/Supervisor

Admissions Interviews are conducted on an as needed basis.

**Note:** Failure to undergo the background check will result in exclusion from admission consideration. An individual with a criminal conviction is not automatically excluded from admission; the School will evaluate the time frame, nature, gravity, and relevancy of the conviction or charge offense in making a decision. Applicants may appeal the decision and will have the opportunity to present information to dispute the background check.

#### **Transfer Credit**

Students may receive credit for courses taken at another institution as transfer credit. The number of hours accepted as transfer credit will be assessed on a case-by-case basis. The maximum allowed credit is 11 credit hours for the MACM. Transfer credit can only be considered when a student has not yet had their degree conferred from their previous higher education institution. Only courses taken at a regionally accredited college or university are considered for transfer credit.

#### **Scholarships and Tuition**

Tuition is \$545 per credit hour after a 60% tuition grant has automatically been applied. A completed application for admission also serves as a student's application to be considered for a merit-based scholarship. Scholarships are not guaranteed, but we recommend applying for admission as soon as possible. We have rolling admissions which means you can apply up until classes begin.

For priority consideration for scholarship and admission into the program, you'll want to apply by our Priority Deadlines.

Spring Priority Deadline: October 15Fall Priority Deadline: January 15
